His resignation as Thomas Worthington High School principal and employment as journalism teacher at Worthington Kilbourne High School were approved by the Worthington Board of Education on Monday night (July 9th). Seven applicants - five of them from central Ohio - have been selected to be interviewed for the treasurer's position by the Worthington Board of Education. The board is seeking a successor to Jonathan Boyd, who resigned in May to become treasurer of the Cincinnati schools. The board hopes to have a new treasurer hired by the end of July.
