**1. Yes or no, do you agree that there should be no significant new traffic introduced into the Colonial Hills neighborhood? How will you ensure this in the future?**

I agree. The Colonial Hills already has a significant amount of cut through traffic, more traffic in the neighborhood will cause a public safety risk for residents. I would work to ensure that any development at the Harding/Boundless location takes this traffic concern into consideration by not connecting through to the south side of the property.

**2. What improvements to Colonial Hills do you propose?**

For too long we have not completely address this issue that is causing property damage and property devaluation. Additionally, I would like to pursue updating or rebuilding the Selby Shelter House that has outlived its lifespan and needs upgraded. **3. How do you propose to upgrade the water system in Worthington?**

I think we have to look at all state and federal funding options that are available through the OEPA to partner with the city of Columbus and Franklin County to completely upgrade our water mains. Funding water infrastructure is expensive but not doing so will continue to cost the residents and city even more in the long run. We need to strive for clean, safe, and affordable water in Worthington.

**4. How would you diversify and stabilize the revenue stream in the City of Worthington?**

First we have to solidify the businesses we have in Worthington and fill the empty shops and buildings with businesses that we currently have like Anthem. Additionally, we have to look for ways to develop new businesses along High St., Wilson Bridge Rd., and in other areas to increase the income tax revenue that largely drives the city's budget and the city's ability to provide high quality city services.
