Keep your pets safe this winter!

Now that the cold winds are upon us, please remember our four-footed friends. Consider bringing outside pets inside when the weather is lower than 30 degrees especially if it is snowing. It is harder for an animal to maintain their body temperature if their fur is wet. Ohio law mandates that pet owners provide adequate shelter, food and water. For animals kept outside for any length of time, this means a doghouse with four walls and a top. Access to a shed or garage is not adequate. A dog can maintain their body heat in an appropriately-sized doghouse but not a large drafty structure. In the coldest weather, straw can be used to provide additional warmth.

Cats are generally more independent than dogs but even our feline friends need warm shelter. Frostbite can affect animals especially on the tips of their ears, tails, faces, and footpads.

Make sure outdoor pet water and food bowls are not metal. When the temperature is low, your pet's tongue can stick or freeze to metal surfaces. I think we all remember the scene from *A Christmas Story* when the boy takes a dare to lick the flag poll! Also make sure, Spot's water has not frozen over.

Did you know antifreeze is responsible for thousands of accidental pet poisonings each year? Clean up spills promptly and properly dispose of containers. As little as one teaspoon of antifreeze is enough to make a pet violently ill.

Dog walkers — now that it is dark earlier, make certain motorists can see you crossing the street. Consider adding reflectiv3ee tape to Rover's leash. Take a flashlight. Even if you have enough light to see, maybe the motorists cannot see you. Be safe, and keep picking up after your pet.

Is your dog licensed? Renewals take place from December 1 to January 31 and can be completed online at the Franklin County Auditor's website at www.doglicense.franklincountyohio.gov. A current rabies tag is required (for dogs 3 months of age and older) in order to obtain a license.
